Postcodes are given for the churches to assist Sat Nav users. Occasionally they may not be the church itself (where post is not usually delivered) but the nearest building instead. Also given are the Ordnance Survey grid reference. Finally, after "///", are the *what3words* reference. The what3words algorithm takes complex GPS coordinates and converts them into unique 3 word addresses. It means anyone can talk about anywhere with 3 simple words.

FELLOWSHIP GRANTS

One of the objectives of the Association is stated as:

"to promote fellowship and harmony among bellringers generally including organising social meetings and making gifts on behalf of the Association and to promote goodwill and understanding between bellringers and the general public;"

The Association will make funds available to local bands of ringers to support initiatives that achieve the purpose of the objective.

For example this might include (but is not limited to):

- Holding social events and outings
- Improvement of ringing chambers
- Installation of belfry cameras and monitors visible to the public
- Production of local publicity material
- Gifts for individuals whose contribution to local ringing is worthy of recognition by the association
- Expenses for attendance at national events where the Association would not otherwise be represented such as the Ringing World National Youth Contest striking competition

Grants would not be awarded for:

- Any belfry maintenance or restoration work that would normally be considered for a grant from the BRF
- Any training or associated activity that would normally be considered by the Training Group

Guidelines

1. Bands of ringers within the Association may apply for a Fellowship Grant not exceeding £200 in any one year.

2. The amount awarded for a Fellowship Grant will be no more than 50% of the total expected cost of the initiative.

3. Grants will be funded from the General Funds of the Association.

4. The total value of grants made in any calendar year will be capped at an amount agreed from time to time by the General Committee. The limit is currently £2,000.

5. Applications for Fellowship Grants should be made to the General Secretary and sponsored by at least two other current members of the General Committee.

6. Provided the sponsors and the General Secretary all agree the application achieves the objective and meets the conditions of a Fellowship Grant it shall be awarded immediately.

7. If no such agreement exists the Grant shall be referred to the General Master whose decision shall be final.

8. At least once a year the General Committee will discuss the Fellowship Grants awarded and revise its guidance for future grants if it is thought necessary.

9. Details of Fellowship Grants awarded during each year will be published in the Annual Report.

GENERAL SECRETARY AND TREASURER REPORT

2019 has been a steep learning curve for me with my new responsibilities of General Secretary and Treasurer for the association following the election of Officers at the AGM in May.

I starting ringing in 2014 following becoming a ringing "widow" after my husband became obsessed with his fairly new found hobby. Being a late starter is tough and it is a very regular occurrence for me to say if only I had discovered this enjoyable pastime when I was young. From an early stage I was astonished at the dedication of experienced ringers in their commitment to teach others, giving so much time but can now see the pleasure of a learner's progression. Within a couple of years I found myself as tower secretary and contact and then involved in running the Association. Only goes to show you don't need many years of ringing experience.

Association member numbers dropped slightly in 2019, reducing from 605 to 598 however the enthusiasm in attending and running events throughout the Association is encouraging.

The training events have been plentiful with numerous excellent follow-up sessions allowing for consolidated practice of the newly learned skills. Thank you to Martin and the training group for organising these events and to the trainers for their undertaking of the sessions.

In May the AGM hosted by Northern District was held at St Mary's Battersea with a short ringing outing around local towers before and ringing after the meeting and included a plentiful afternoon tea served in the Crypt. The meeting was attended by 56 members who amongst other business voted in favour of the revision to the rules.

6 and 8 bell striking contests were held at St John the Devine, Merton on 27th April. Kingston retained the trophies for both competitions beating Putney by just one point in each. The Surrey Strikers took a trip to Liverpool in July to take part in the annual Ringing World National Youth Contest. This was an action packed day including tower tours around the city centre. In August the annual Call Change competition took place at Ashtead with just four teams competing for the Sid Saban trophy. Redhill won the competition with one less fault than Battersea. In October, Kingston hosted the London 12 bell competition and our Association team continued their year on year improvement coming a very creditable 6 out of 10 against some formidable opposition. We also entered a band in September into the10 bell (southern counties) Essex trophy coming a close 5th out of 6!

The Bell Restoration Fund has continued to grow with valuable contributions from a variety of sources mentioned later in the report. In 2019 the fund made contributions to two projects – St Nicholas, Godstone and St Mary's Ewell.

The General finances continue to look healthy and with a slight increase of income over the previous year and an almost identical amount of expenditure during the year. There was one fellowship grant made and one recipient of the Violet Potter award. The legacy account paid towards two projects, a £4,000 contribution to the Bletchingley's training bells and £700 to the Oxted simulator with a further grant of £250 due this year. In addition a grant of £1,200 will support the simulator installation at St John's Caterham.

As I approach completing my first year as General Secretary I would like to thank everybody who has provided me with support and advice as I find my feet in this role. Richard made it a tough act to follow.

NORTHERN DISTRICT REPORT

I indicated a year ago that after 4 years as District Master the role should pass on to someone new with fresh ideas and verve! However, following the January ADM the post sadly remains vacant. Throughout my time as District Master the aim of the committee was to promote ringing in the Surrey Association community and beyond. I do feel there is a role for territorial Associations within ringing despite some current thinking. They can offer experience and social support as we strive to attract, train and retain ringers within our community. However, without an organising committee, what we have achieved will decline.

During 2019, the Committee organised a varied programme of events that hopefully provided ringing and social opportunities of interest to all members.

General practices were held at Beddington, Kingston, Mitcham, Mortlake, Thames Ditton and Wandsworth (Holy Trinity) with some having a particular focus. This included Call Changes and Plain Hunt on higher number of bells, Plain Bob Triples and Major, through to practices where all abilities were catered for. Merton (St John the Divine) in particular were very helpful hosting the Association's 6 and 8 Bell Striking Competitions and then the Nomination Meeting at short notice.

The monthly programme of Surprise Major practices at Carshalton continued. In addition to a mix of the Standard 8 methods, Glasgow and some methods from the Pickled Egg Project were added to the repertoire. We hope to continue these practices.

Those wishing to extend their ringing on higher numbers of bells had the opportunity to attend a monthly practice at Croydon Minster run by Shirley McGill. An advance monthly 12 bell practice at South Croydon enabled a Surrey band to successful participate in the London 12 Bell Competition held at Kingston, were a respectable placing was achieved, only being beaten by the top London bands which included the Cumberland Youths, College Youths and St Pauls Cathedral. These practices will continue and are open to everybody as appropriate.

Youth ringing continued with the Surrey group being re-branded as the *Surrey Strikers*. A Surrey youth team entered the Ringing World National Striking Contest held in Liverpool which everybody enjoyed. Local knowledge meant we could organise a *Beatles* themed tour around the city, possibly more relevant to the older members of the party who were helping on the day. It was also pleasing some of the group managed to ring a Quarter Peal on hand bells during the return train journey while the helpers rested!

Over the last 4 years, the most well attended events were outings! In 2019 three such events were organised. The Association's AGM in May was hosted by Battersea. This involved a mini tour north of the river followed by an entertaining short address by the Very Revd Paul Kennington, cream tea and ringing at Battersea afterwards. The autumn saw a 'walk and ride' tour to the Walthamstow area where the pleasures of Madam Zandos' for those that stayed for a drink at the end was enjoyed! The Northern District ADM in January was based around Wandsworth. After ringing at Holy Trinity a short meeting took place after a feast of baked potatoes with a variety of tasty fillings, wine and real ale. The evening finished with ringing at All Saints – a rare opportunity that those attending took full advantage of.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT REPORT

I am pleased to report that we have continued to provide a variety of events both social and related to ringing. We continue to help ringers as well as providing meets where they can enjoy ringing. The calendar of meets is deliberately very varied. I would like to thank all those who have helped during the year to make things work. Our events are held on the fourth Saturday of the month and include 2 Outings (Summer & Winter) – both organised by Matt Cousins and brilliantly timed, a learners outing which included a pub lunch so that the learners attending could chat to each other, 5 Allcomers' practices at Southern District Churches as well as a popular quiz!

I am sad to announce that the following members of the Southern District died during the year: Brenda Judd (Betchworth) John Saysell (Coulsdon); Tony Gullett (Kingswood); Michael Wallis (Lingfield). However we had 24 new members and our total membership has increased slightly over the last few years.

One of the features of our Summer calendar is the British Summertime Friendly striking competition in which towers challenge each other and compete; it is judged, and a winner declared. Whilst the judge is making up his or her mind, the home tower provides refreshments and ringers are able to chat to each other. With such beautiful churches and grounds in the District this becomes an enjoyable experience. IT is one of the jewels in our crown!

There has been some research on the internet about the usefulness of ringing practices and I am pleased that our emphasis on a quarter peal day and providing extra focussed practices were well praised. This reflects the comments made by those who have taken part in these.

We got 4 quarters on the Quarter peal day and in the District rang just under 90 quarters in 2019. These were for various reasons and the most common method was Grandsire. BELFRY REPAIR FUND

BRF funds have continued their steady re-growth in 2019, with income of just under £4k and grant payments of £1.9k. The level of receipts was almost identical to that of 2018, if the 2018 allocation of £1.2k from the Peal Fund is excluded. The contribution from the Numbers Club grew by 7% - many thanks being due, as usual, to Jill Wigney for her hard work in running it as well as to all those who participate. Clothing sales made a useful contribution, after a fallow year in 2018, due to the efficient organisation of Kate Wills. On November 2nd, a hardy team of volunteers, at least equal in size to those of previous years, presented themselves for parking duties at Brockham Bonfire, knowing that the extremely adverse weather might mean insufficient funds would be raised to reward their efforts. In the event, the Bonfire organisers were able to donate a generous £550.

The year-end total fund value was £19,050.75, just over £15k is now earning interest in the deposit account.

Donations were received during the year from the towers of Benhilton, Betchworth, Caterham, Kingston, Reigate, Southwark Cathedral and the PCCs of Beddington, Oxted, Ewell, Walton and a "St Johns Church" (is anyone aware which church this may be?).

Our thanks to those who have made donations during the year, whether by standing order, one-off payment or contribution to a collection.

Chris Clementi has been on the BRF Committee for about 25 years, since his tower bells (St Mary's Caterham) were installed. He has now decided it is time to retire from the Committee and so we thank him for his many years of service.

NARRATIVE INFORMATION

The objects of the Charity are to provide "for or towards the cost of bells, their fittings, or repairs thereto or any structural or mechanical work essential to the proper functioning of bells ringing full circle provided always that the bell or bells concerned are located within the county" (of Surrey as recognised in 1880).

The Charity is part of The Surrey Association of Church Bell Ringers (the "Association") which is managed by a General Committee elected by members annually.

The BRF Committee members are the Managing Trustees of the fund, a registered charity, but with the decision as to whether to give Grants or not in the hands of the Custodian Trustees - the General Committee - so as to give proper a protection for the charitable funds.

The BRF Committee shall comprise as a minimum the following:

- The elected BRF Secretary
- One of the Association General Master, General Secretary or the Assistant General Secretary
- One member of the Southern District Committee, nominated each year by the Southern District
- Committee

- One member of the Northern District Committee, nominated each year by the Northern District Committee

The Committee may co-opt other Association members to join the Committee as desired and as necessary from time to time, particularly in relation to any specific projects. The Committee shall elect its Chairman from among its members.

TRAINING GROUP REPORT

During the year we have run courses for ringers addressing:

- Stedman Doubles
- Stedman Triples
- Beyond Plain Bob St Simon's, St Martin's, St Clements (run twice due to demand)
- Ringing up and Down in Peal
- Listening and Striking, with ART

We've run the traditional twice-yearly training days, offering courses from Foundation Skills through to Plain Bob Doubles. Debate continues over the format of these events, and whether they represent a good use of effort. They are popular with students, but increasingly struggle to get sufficient support from helpers.

Each course we run can only reach a limited number of students, so a key focus is to support and develop the training capability of the Association's members. In February, Roger Booth led a workshop at Oxted on how to use simulators in teaching change ringing. The course covered tips on setup and troubleshooting the system, practical exercises to use with students, and the chance for instructors to practice using simulators themselves. In November, Clare McArdle of the Birmingham School of Bell Ringers led a seminar for ringing trainers. This combined discussion on how to use our trainers to best effect, with trying out various practical and desktop exercises.

We also completely revised the training website. All courses are now booked online. We experimented with the use of PayPal for online payment but are discontinuing this system due to high cost and several users experiencing difficulty using it. Bank to bank transfer is now the preferred method for paying for courses. Course materials are published via the website and are available as a resource for all. If you have training resources you've written, please share them with the training officer; if there are training websites you've found useful, please share those too.

On a personal note, it is with great regret that I feel I have to stand down after only one year as Training Officer. A "restructuring" of my employer means I have to start the process of looking for new occupation, and this may well require me to relocate. I don't feel I can give training the attention it needs while this is going on. I wish my successor all the best, and hope you will give them your full support.

SIMULATORS

Simulators for ringing – why would you want to do that when the real things are just hanging around waiting for you?

The Coronavirus situation is a good example of why the modern simulators are so useful. Many of the currently available systems can, as well as being directly linked to real bells, be used independently on a wide range of systems including mobile phones. No longer are we tied to our ropes, we are freed to explore methods in the comfort of our homes, on our way to work, and anywhere we want!

The bells, other than the one we're trying to ring, never go wrong and always strike at the right time allowing the learner to focus on their own mistakes. They don't get bored or frustrated and they don't shout at us which allows us to try, try and try again and then again, until we're satisfied or need a break. Then they're ready the next time we want to practice.

Good ringing requires a combination of rhythmic, aural and visual skills however when learning many of us rely heavily of visual clues e.g. movement of the other ropes (Ropesight). Whilst extremely useful this leads to less accurate ringing as it doesn't always accurately reflect the timing of striking). The non-Tower simulators focus us on learning Methods, touches, rhythm, listening all of which can help with improving striking, some will also simulate the delay between "pulling" and the bell sounding which further improves the timing aspect and further focuses on the listening aspect.

There are a range of skills needed by bellringers and most, but not all, are improved using simulators:

- Handling the co-ordination hands and arms, the accurate and consistent catching of ropes. A tower simulator will help here as the ringer is still using a real bell
 - people have used the cycling analogy of riding a bike without falling off
- Listening/Timing understanding when a bell strikes vs. when the rope is pulled as well as the relationship of the ringer's bell striking and when other bells strike.
 - Riding in a group whilst keeping equidistant
- Dynamic handling accurately controlling the bell during order changes

 changing order with the bike in front or behind seamlessly
 - Methods learning complex sequences of changes
 - keeping with bikes; learning a route, and a changing sequence to ride and then do so without visual aids or markings.

One of the latest entrants to ringing, as a direct result of the COVID-19 lockdown is at <u>www.ringingroom.com</u> which allows groups of up to 12 to join a virtual ringing group and ring together. This is very actively being developed but already a great addition.

Within the Association we have a growing number of towers with Simulators. If you want to know more or are interested in having a go do contact the correspondent at the relevant tower, or join in at one of the events that might be organised at that tower.

COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER REPORT - 2019

Throughout 2019 the main focus of my attention has been on building momentum for our bold initiative to improve membership engagement which was started in 2018. At the AGM in May a series of rule changes were adopted that provided a strong endorsement for our agenda of change. A cross district working party has now been formed led by the General Master to follow through with implementing a programme of process and system changes. The community of bell ringers on Facebook continues to flourish and thousands of ringers from all over the world are taking part in discussions and sharing information on the site. The Surrey Association has had a Facebook page since Nov 2011 which we use to share news and event details and publish performance details from Bellboard. Looking back over the year our young ringers visit to Liverpool in July to take part in the Ringing World National Youth Contest grabbed the most attention online. 

SAFEGUARDING



ASSOCIATION RULES last updated: 11 May 2019

TITLE

1 The title of the Association shall be "The Surrey Association of Church Bell Ringers".

DEFINITIONS

- 2 In these rules the following expressions shall have the following meanings:
 - a "the County" shall mean the County of Surrey as recognised in 1880;
 - b "Ordinary Resolution" and "Special Resolution" shall mean a motion passed by a simple majority and a three-quarters majority respectively of those members voting and entitled to vote at the meeting at which it is moved;
 - c reference to "meetings of the Association" and, where the context admits, to "the Association" shall mean "the Association in General Meeting" and shall not extend to meetings of a District;
 - d "the Council" shall mean the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers;
 - e words importing the masculine gender shall, where the context so admits, also import the feminine gender.

OBJECTS

- 3 The objects of the Association shall be:
 - a to promote, advance, maintain and support the ringing of bells for services;
 - b the recognition of bellringers as church workers;
 - c to facilitate and assist in the instruction and practice of both the art and science of change-ringing;
 - d to institute schemes for, supply information as to, and to assist in, the provision, repair, maintenance or transfer of church bells and their fittings and necessary apparatus including equipment for sound control measures whether through the administration of the Belfry Repair Fund or otherwise;
 - e to promote fellowship and harmony among bellringers generally including organising social meetings and making gifts on behalf of the Association and to promote goodwill and understanding between bellringers and the general public;
 - f in construing and of the paragraphs (a) to (e) of this Rule, no paragraph shall be deemed to be predominant and no object shall be deemed to be subsidiary to another;
 - g to commission, print, publish, and distribute and/or sell, in any part of the world, literature relating to all or any of the above objects and to the history of bells and bellringing;
 - h to do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any of the above objects and in particular (but without raising any loan save with the authority of a Special Resolution of the Association) to expend monies on or in furtherance of any of the above objects. Such monies may be expended on the authority of an Ordinary Resolution of the General Committee or (if part of the funds of a District) of its District Committee and in such case the members from time to time of such committees acting in good faith shall not be responsible for loss.

AREA

- 4 Pursuit of the objects shall be conducted usually within the County but shall not be limited thereto.
- 5 The County shall be divided into such number of Districts with such boundaries as the Association by Special Resolution shall decide from time to time.

TYPES OF MEMBERSHIP

6 The types of membership recognised by the Association are detailed in the table below:

* All Members eligible to vote shall receive a copy of the Association Annual Report.

JOINING THE ASSOCIATION

- 7 (i) A new member satisfying the criteria for membership can join the Association on completion of a membership form with sponsor and on payment of the current year's subscription.
 - (ii) All new members must agree to be bound by the Rules of the Association and have their application sponsored. Sponsors must have been a Resident Ringing Member of the Association for at least the preceding two calendar years, or be an Honorary Life Member.
 - (iii) Resident Ringing Members shall be affiliated with the District in which they are resident or most frequently ring. New members eligible for more than one District may choose their affiliation by writing to the relevant District Secretary.
 - (iv) Although common it is not necessary to be attached to a tower to be a member of the Association. Ringers who are unattached to a tower but otherwise qualify as a Resident Ringing Member may join the Association and choose their affiliation to a District.
 - (v) An existing Resident Ringing Member may choose to change their District affiliation provided they qualify by residency or place of ringing by notifying, in writing, both District Secretaries.
 - (vi) A ringer who is not resident in the County and is not a frequent Sunday Service ringer in the County may join as a Non-Resident Member, on completion of a membership form with sponsor and on payment of the subscription.

SUBSCRIPTIONS

- 8 (i) The subscription and concession rates shall be kept under review by the General Committee and set by a Special Resolution of the Association for the following year.
 - (ii) The methods of payment and collection of subscriptions shall be agreed by the General Committee and be appropriate to the type of membership, affiliation and processes available for collection at the time.
 - (iii) The total subscription raised each year shall be shared between the Association and the Districts. The basis on which subscriptions are shared shall be determined by a Special Resolution of the General Committee.
 - (iv) Annually renewable memberships shall be continuous with all subscriptions becoming due on 1st January each year.
 - (v) The subscription of any annually renewable membership commencing on or after 1st October shall run to 31st December of the following year.
 - (vi) A member resigning or being expelled before their subscription is paid shall not be liable for that year's subscription. Once paid no refunds shall be given for resigning or expelled members.

CONDUCT OF MEMBERS

- 9 (i) Members eligible to vote may only do so in person at a meeting of the Association.
 - (ii) Members with voting rights will be eligible to vote at all meetings of the Association and at meetings of the District to which they are affiliated. Honorary Life Members may vote at all meetings of the Association and at any District meeting regardless of their affiliation.

LEAVING THE ASSOCIATION

10 Membership of the Association shall cease if a member dies, resigns, lapses or is expelled.

- (i) Resigns by notifying the District or General Secretary they no longer wish to be a member of the Association.
- (ii) Lapses by failing to pay their subscription renewal within 12 months of the date it became due.
- (iii) Expulsion on completion of the process for expulsion of a member (see below).
- (iv) A Resident Ringing Member who moves away from or ceases to ring within the County may transfer their membership to a Non-Resident Ringing Member upon notification, in writing, to the General Secretary or the appropriate District Secretary.

EXPULSION OF A MEMBER

- 11 (i) The General Committee shall consider any case for expulsion of a member and may, after an Ordinary Resolution, invite a member to resign within a given time period.
 - (ii) If no such resignation is received within the time given the General Secretary shall organise an Extraordinary meeting of the Association and propose a motion for Special Resolution at that meeting for the expulsion of the member.
 - (iii) The member has the right to be informed of any complaint against them and be invited to speak at any meeting where a proposal has been made to expel them.

OFFICERS

- 12 The Association by Ordinary Resolution shall appoint any person as President of the Association for a term not exceeding five years. This rule shall not prevent any person being re-elected for a further term or terms of years.
- 13 An honorary life member may by Special Resolution of the Association be appointed a Vice-President of the Association to hold office for life. The Bishops of Southwark, Guildford, Croydon, Kingston-upon-Thames and Woolwich shall, ex-officio, be Vice-Presidents of the Association.
- 14 The Association annually by Ordinary Resolution shall appoint any person as Independent Examiner to independently examine the accounts of the Districts and of the Association. They may not hold an office which confers membership of the General Committee.
- 15 The Association shall be affiliated to the Council and Representatives shall be elected in accordance with the Council's constitution for the time being. The Association shall recognise and abide by the rulings of the Council and shall pay the reasonable travelling and incidental expenses of such Representatives in attending the meetings of the Council.
- 16 The General Officers (in order of seniority and their responsibilities) shall be a General Master (who shall, inter alia, be the Chairman at the business meetings of the Association and of the General Committee and shall organise ringing meetings of the Association), a General Secretary (who shall, inter alia, act as Treasurer of the Association, conduct all correspondence on behalf of the Association and the General Committee and maintain a register of members and their respective classes), an Assistant General Secretary (who shall, inter alia, take minutes of business meetings of the Association and the General Committee and perform all such other

functions as the General Secretary may delegate to him from time to time), a Belfry Repair Fund Secretary (who shall, inter alia, coordinate the belfry repair activities of the Association including keeping accounts and compliance with the requirements of the Charity Commission, a Training Officer (who shall, inter alia, coordinate training within the Association), and a Communications Officer (who shall, inter alia, advise the General Committee on matters relating to member and public communication, edit the Association's newsletter and coordinate the Association's online presence).

- 17 District Officers shall be a District Master, a District Secretary, an Assistant District Secretary (who shall perform the same functions for their District as the corresponding General Officers perform for the Association respectively) and three District Committee Members.
- 18 Only a resident ringing member or honorary life member is eligible as General Officer or District Officer. No member may be General Master for more than three consecutive years. A Resident Ringing Member is only eligible as a District Officer for the District to which they are affiliated for the time being.
- 19 No member may be elected to more than one General and one District post at any one time. Officers shall be elected in order of seniority. Newly elected officers come into office at the close of the meeting at which they are elected, save for a Master who comes into office immediately upon election.
- 20 The General Officers shall be elected annually by Ordinary Resolution at the Annual General Meeting. District Officers shall be elected annually by Ordinary Resolution at their District's Annual District Meeting. Casual vacancies among Officers may be filled by Ordinary Resolution of the relevant District Committee or, in the case of a General Officer, of the General Committee.

COMMITTEES

- 21 A District Committee shall consist of the District Officers for the District of whom three shall form a quorum. The General Committee shall consist of the members of all District Committees and the General Officers of whom seven shall form a quorum.
- 22 A Committee meeting shall be convened forthwith upon the request of any member thereof to the appropriate Secretary who shall give at least three days' notice of such meeting to all members of that Committee. The power of the Committee is unlimited within the Rules and objects of the Association. It may delegate such power to whom it thinks fit and may revoke such power provided that any such revocation shall have no effect until received by the delegate and shall be void in so far as it purports to be of retrospective effect.

MEETINGS

- 23 The General Secretary and each District Secretary shall produce accounts annually to the Independent Examiner and seek the approval thereto of a meeting of the General Committee (and of the Annual General Meeting) and of the District Committee (and the Annual District Meeting) respectively.
- 24 The appropriate Committee shall arrange the times, dates and venues of all meetings of the District or of the Association and shall have power to alter such arrangements save that the date of the Annual General Meeting shall be held on a Saturday in May and an Annual District Meeting shall be held by each District on a Saturday in January or February.
- 25 An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Association or of a District shall be convened within 42 days of the receipt by the appropriate Secretary of the instruction of the appropriate Master, or of the written requests of at least 12 members (other than non-resident members) who shall in the case of such requests in respect of a District be attached to that District.
- 26 No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Association or at an Annual District Meeting unless a quorum of members entitled to vote at such meeting is present. A quorum shall be twenty in the case of a meeting of the Association and ten in the case of an Annual District Meeting.
- 27 The resident ringing members and/or honorary life members frequenting a particular tower shall cause their District Secretary to be told of a tower correspondent to receive postal and/or email notices of meetings. All notices will also be placed on the Association's website. Accidental omission to give any (but not all) such notices shall not invalidate the meeting concerned.
- 28 At least 14 clear days' notice and 28 clear days' notice shall be given of Annual Meetings and Extraordinary General Meetings respectively.

CONDUCT OF MEETINGS

- 29 Meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the law of England and Wales and the General Committee may prepare standing orders in accordance therewith for the guidance of chairmen.
- 30 If the appropriate master is at any time absent from a meeting it shall forthwith proceed by Ordinary Resolution to elect a member to act as chairman in the Master's absence. Such election is to be conducted by the appropriate Secretary or other member, on a show of hands.
- 31 Save as otherwise provided in these Rules, a proposal for a motion must be made in writing to reach the appropriate Secretary at least 28 clear days before the meeting at which such motion is to be voted upon. All motions require a seconder before being put to the meeting. Alterations, additions or deletions to the Rules or any matter directly concerning finance (save for the adoption of the accounts) may only be effected by Special Resolution. Notwithstanding the foregoing the meeting may by Special Resolution agree to discuss and to vote upon a motion received within less than the stipulated notice.
- 32 All motions for the election of Vice-Presidents, an Independent Examiner, Council Representatives and General Officers shall be proposed either orally at an Annual District Meeting or in accordance with the immediately preceding Rule. Motions for the election of District Officers shall be proposed either orally at the Nomination Meeting or in accordance with the immediately preceding Rule.
- 33 If no motion is proposed for the election of any member to an office (other than that of Vice-President) the chairman of the meeting in his discretion may accept the proposal of one or more motions for the election of members to that office notwithstanding the immediately preceding Rule.
- 34 If the motion for the election of an officer is contested, the resolution of the meeting shall be decided by secret ballot. The chairman shall appoint such tellers to conduct the ballot as are willing to do so and who shall, if possible, not be members of the Association. A motion proposed and seconded for the election of a member to an office for which no other member has been moved shall be declared duly carried by the chairman of the meeting without voting.

35 Any other business is to be restricted to discussion and the raising and answer of queries.

36 No notice need be given of motions for the adoption of minutes, reports or accounts.

- 37 A peal can be recognised as having been rung for the Association provided that the majority of the band are members of the Association (eg. on 8 bells 5 ringers must be members allowing for a maximum of 3 non-members to be in the band) and the composition meets the standard accepted by the CCCBR.
- 38 The Association by Special Resolution may dissolve and provide for the disposal of its net assets, provided always that except when such dissolution is with a view to reconstruction or amalgamation, the Belfry Repair Fund shall be administered by the Council.

LIBRARY

39 The Association shall maintain a library and the General Committee shall be responsible for the annual appointment of a Librarian and instructing him in the proper administration of the Library and providing for the housing and adequate insurance of the Library.

BELFRY REPAIR FUND

- 40 The Association shall hold a Belfry Repair Fund, to be administered by the General Committee through the Belfry Repair Fund Secretary. The Fund shall be registered as a charity. The General Committee shall have the same unrestricted power of investment of the Fund as if it were absolutely entitled thereto and when acting in good faith shall not be responsible for loss.
- 41 The General Committee may in its absolute discretion make a grant out of either the capital or income of the Belfry Repair Fund for or towards the cost of bells, their fittings or repairs thereto or any structural, mechanical or sound control work for the proper functioning of bells ringing full circle provided always that the bell or bells concerned are located within the County.
- 42 The Belfry Repair Fund Secretary shall maintain account of the Belfry Repair Fund distinguishing monies in the Fund from all other monies held in the name of the Association. Collections shall be taken for the Fund at every meeting of the Association and at every business meeting of the Districts, such monies as are collected shall be passed to the Belfry Repair Fund Secretary.


